

Rhédey Castle

Sângeorgiu de Pădure (Hu: Erdőszentgyörgy)

Sângeorgiu de Pădure is located in the eastern part of Mureș County, along the upper course of Târnava Mică, 25 km from Sovata and 35 km from Târgu Mureș.

The main attraction of this small town is Rhédey Castle (18th century), built in Neo-Baroque style, which achieved its current shape between 1807-1809, during renovations. This is where Countess Claudia Rhédey, the beautiful wife of Duke Alexander von Württemberg and great-greatgrandmother of Oueen Elizabeth II of the United Kingdom was born and raised. The beautifully restored castle now houses the exhibition "Mysteria Residentiae Rhédey", in five rooms upstairs, which presents the life of the Rhédey family and the tragic fate of Countess Claudia.

On the ground floor of the building there is the Tourist Information Center and the painting exhibition of Victor Datu, one of the promoters of Cubism in Romania. Upstairs you can visit the commemorative exhibition dedicated to the flooded village of Bezidu Nou.



Visits are possible every hour, only with specialized local guiding (Romanian, Hungarian and English). Please schedule your visit at least one day beforehand.





Castelul Bethlen

Cris (HU: Keresd)

The castle can be visited - YES 🤡

Located 18 km from Sighișoara and 67 km from Târgu Mureș, Bethlen Castle is located in Criș, on a secondary road, in the direction of Sighișoara-Mediaș, 10 km from Daneș.

The foundations of the Renaissance style castle were laid in the 15th century by Miklós Bethlen's son, Márk. The castle was built around a square courtyard and it remained the property of the Bethlen family until nationalization. The most impressive part is the arched wing, which was probably built in 1559, when the castle was enlarged. Equally impressive is the Archers' Tower, a five-level cylindrical dungeon, being the oldest construction of the castle, which had a defensive purpose. The whole ensemble is rich in highly refined decorations, making it one of the most representative civil constructions in the Italian Renaissance style in Transylvania. The Bethlens lived here until the period between the two world wars, after which the castle was nationalized.

In 2007, following the fall of the Communist regime, the heirs recovered the property after a long process, and entrusted it, for a period of fifty years, to the St. Francis Foundation of Deva, in exchange for its renovation.



The castle is open daily from 10:00 to 16:00.

Teleki Castle

Gornești (Hu: Gernyeszeg)

Located upstream of Târgu Mures, 17 km from Târgu Mures and 15 km from Reghin, on the banks of Mures River.

Teleki Castle was built between 1772 and 1803 in Baroque style. under the guidance of three generations of the Teleki family. It has a U-shaped plan in the style of the so-called Grassalkovich palaces. The most beautiful part of the castle is the large salon upstairs, where the original plaster, the two white porcelain stoves in rococo style and three chandeliers have been preserved.

The access to the main entrance is made by crossing a bridge, over what used to be the most surrounding the castle, which has been partially preserved until now. From the main entrance, a hallway connects to the interior courtyard, which leads to the castle park. The English-style park has been enriched with rare trees (Ginkgo Biloba, swamp cedar, birch, oak and plane tree) and is lined with promenade alleys that were once decorated with mythological sculptures from the personal collection of Count Domokos Teleki.

Currently, the castle hosts cultural events, art camps and festivals, and it is included in the tourist circuit.

Máriaffi Castle

Sângeorgiu de Mures (Hu: Marosszentgyörgy)

The castle can be visited - YES 🤡

The recently renovated castle is located in Sângeorgiu de Mureș, about 7 km from Târgu Mureș.

On the top of Sângeorgiu de Mureş commune, in a beautiful setting, lies the two-storey castle of the Máriaffi family, built in 1870.

The castle was owned by the Petki family from Szeklerland until the first half of the 19th century and in 1817 it became the property of the Mériaffi family.

At the end of the 19th century, the castle was renovated in eclectic style and the construction works were executed by master mason Soós Pál from Târgu Mureş. The castle has a symmetrical structure, both façades of the building measuring 28 meters, with an ornate appearance offered by the windows framed by shutters and cornices.

The main façade, with a porch supported by arches, adorned with pillars with a Corinthian-style capital, overlooks the river Mureş.

Kemény Castle

Brâncovenesti (Hu: Marosvécs)

Located 38 km from Târgu Mures and 11 km from Reghin, in the direction of Deda.

The settlement was owned by the Kemény family for three hundred years. The two-storey building, with bastions at the four corners, received its current shape during the reconstructions between 1537 and 1557, and in 1818 it acquired the late Baroque look, which is reflected faithfully to this day. The building played a significant cultural role in the interwar period. On the initiative of Baron János Kemény, the Helikon community was formed in Brâncovenesti in 1926, which was a free writing community of Transylvanian writers and poets and whose members met once a year, by invitation, between 1926 and 1944. The tombs of some of the Kemény family members and the Hungarian writer Albert Wass can be found in the shades of the park's oak trees.

World War II did not cause much damage to the castle, but after the family left the area, the population completely devastated the building, and after 1949 it became a hospice for children with severe mental disabilities. Since 2014, the castle has once again become the property of the Kemény family, who opened it to the public!

Degenfeld Castle

Cuci (Hu: Kutyfalva)

The castle can be visited - YES 🧇

Located 40 km from Târgu Mureş and 76 km from Cluj Napoca.

Degenfeld Castle was built in the 19th century at the initiative of Count Degenfeld Miksa Kristóf and completed with two wings at the beginning of the 20th century, by Degenfeld Lajos. The Neoclassical building has a symmetrical plan, on a single level and has a portico with columns in the central axis. Through this portico you can reach the former Great Hall, which takes you further to the smoking room and the guest rooms. The water supply for the building was provided by a water tower, which was a rarity throughout Europe at the time.

Currently, the building serves as a cultural centre, however, a board game room and an escape room are available here for the younger generation. Guided tours are organized in the castle, where you can see exhibitions about the history of the Degenfeld family, as well as an exhibition dedicated to the poet Petrőczy Kata Szidónia, the first representative of Hungarian Baroque literature.

Haller Castle

Ogra (HU: Marosugra)

Located 24 km from Târgu Mureş and 92 km from Cluj Napoca.

Haller Castle was built in the 17th century and was owned by several Transylvanian noble families. In 1610 the estate, together with the village of Ogra, became the property of the Haller family and remained the property of the family for 300 years.

The castle gained its current shape in the 18th century, after the transformation of the former manor that stood on its place before. In time, it had different destinations (school, boarding school, kindergarten, village dispensary), and later, after its restitution, it was sold by the heirs and transformed by a private company into a castle hotel.

Today, the castle offers great accommodation, a restaurant and a wellness center.





Rákóczi-Bornemisza Castle

Gurghiu (Hu: Görgényszentimre)

Located 12 km from Reghin and 42 km from Târgu Mureş, on the Gurghiu Valley.

The main attractions in Gurghiu are the Baroque castle and the dendrological park. In the same place where Rákóczi-Bornemisza Castle lies today, there was a Renaissance-style hunting lodge built in 1642, which was restored and expanded in Baroque style by János Bornemisza between 1718 and 1734. In 1881, Crown Prince Rudolf of Austria remodeled it and turned the building into a hunting lodge, while the granary next to the castle was turned into a guest house. After the tragic death of Prince Rudolf, in 1893 the Vocational School of Foresters was set up here, which became the Forestry College in 2003, until 2008, when the historical monument was transferred to the administration of the Mureş County Museum.

The dendrological park next to the castle was founded by Rákóczi György I. It was later laid out (1820-1830) in English style by Bornemisza Lipót. The 10-hectare area is home to more than 350 species of plants, including 130 exotic trees and plants.

Currently, the castle is not open to the public, but the dendrological park can be visited daily from 08.00 to 17.00.



The Royal Hunting Castle

Located 74 km from Târgu Mureș and 42 km upstream from Reghin, on Gurghiu Valley.

The hunting castle was built between 1925 and 1926, at the initiative of King Ferdinand of Romania and was left to King Carol II and Michael I. After dictator Ceausescu came to power, the property was seized to recover the damage caused during the reign of Carol II. During the communist regime, the building became a meeting place for great leaders, attracted by the beauty of the places and the hunting possibilities.

The architecture of the castle is similar to that of Peleş castle in Sinaia, all the decorative elements inside being made by hand, to order. The decorations have been carefully preserved and cared for to complete and preserve the style that defines the reign of the Romanian monarchs.

Today, it functions as a castle hotel, the rooms that once belonged to kings, queens, nobles and prominent politicians are now offered for accommodation to tourists.





Ugron Castle

Zau de Câmpie (Hu: Mezőzáh)


Located 48 km west-northwest of Târgu Mureş and 61 km from Cluj Naooca.

The castle was built between 1908 and 1912, at the initiative of Baron István Ugron, Minister of Austria and Hungary and Ambassador to the Russian Empire. It is one of the last castles built in the historicism style in Transylvania, in which the architects combined various historical forms (in this case the Neo-Gothic and Neo-Romanesque ones). The building evokes a medieval French castle with a two-storey façade, bastion-like towers and a sculpted and ornate main entrance.

The castle in Zau de Câmpie was built according to the principles of a calendar. It has 365 windows - the same as the number of days in a year, 4 towers - the same as the number of seasons, 52 rooms - the same as the number of weeks in a year, 7 terraces - the same as the number of days in a week and 12 corridors, the same as the number of months in a year. In 1925 István Ugron ceded the castle to his nephew, Baron István Bánffy and his wife, Countess Emma Mikes of Zabola, reserving only a few rooms for himself.

After the nationalization, the castle offered space to many institutions, and currently it is owned by the Mureş County Council and can only admired from the outside!







Pekry-Radák Castle

Ozd (Hu: Magyarózd)

Located 72 km from Târgu Mureş and 20 km from Luduş.

The first thing that greets the traveler when arriving to the village of Ozd is Pekry-Radák Castle, a rectangular castle with bastions in the corners, built in Renaissance style with Baroque (and Gothic) elements, located on a ridge above the village.

Although the castle was extended during the Baroque period (after 1725), it has remained a Renaissance castle due to its character. In terms of size, it is a castle built on 2 levels with smaller or larger rooms (13 per level). Kata Szidónia Petrőczy (1662-1708), the wife of Pekri Lőrinc, lived here almost 400 years ago. She was the first recognized poetess in the history of Hungarian literature and she composed her first works in this castle.

The building belongs to the Bonus Pastor Foundation and is currently under renovation.



The castle can be visited under the guidance of the staff of the Bonus Pastor Therapeutic Center.





Teleki Castle

Dumbrăvioara (Hu: Sáromberke)

It is located 14 km from Târgu Mureş, on the left bank of the Mureş.

The construction of the castle was started in 1769 by the Chancellor of Transylvania, Sámuel Teleki, the founder of the Teleki Library in Târgu Mureş. The north wing was built between 1769 and 1770, and construction of the south wing began in 1773. The overall image of the castle in Dumbrăvioara is influenced by the Neo-Baroque central body, built by the Chancellor's greatgrandson, the explorer Teleki Sámuel. Through the central building, the existing bodies from the 18th century were united, transforming the ensemble, which until then evoked the image of a mansion, into an integrated whole resembling the castles with "cour d'honneur" representative of the Baroque period.

The castle was considered one of the most splendidly arranged Transylvanian aristocratic dwellings of the interwar period, but, following the devastation and post-war looting, the furniture was largely destroyed.

The Teleki family received the castle back in 2005, but sold it. Today it is owned by Dr. Benedek Imre and his family from Târgu Mureş, who want to restore its former historical and cultural value.

Dániel Castle

Gănești (Hu: Vámosgálfalva)

Located 31 km from Târgu Mureş, 56 km from Sighişoara and 5 km from Târnăveni.

According to historical sources, the owner of the 19th-century Neoclassical castle, Dániel Mihály, was a descendant of the Armenian Dániel family in Gherla, and the castle and estate were probably bought by him. In 1949, at the time of the nationalization of the property, Dániel Mihály's son was the second owner.

The main building on the hill, as well as the other adjacent staff buildings, were built in the 19th century. Apart from the main building, well positioned with pilasters and the Neoclassical tympanum, the rest of the annexes have undergone numerous transformations over the years.

After nationalization, the building complex functioned as a collective farm administrative centre, and after 1990 it was returned to the Dániel family. The family sold the property, and now it operates as a hotel with a restaurant and wine cellar.





Bálintitt Castle

Ernei (Hu: Nagyernye)

Located 12 km from Târgu Mureș, in the commune of Ernei.

The castle of the Bálintitt family from Ernei was built in Neo-Baroque style, probably in the 18th century and it received a Neo-Gothic look in the 19th century, following some modifications. In 1946, the north wing of the castle was demolished, becoming an L-shaped building . The castle had 18 rooms and a library with a collection of about 15,000 volumes: books in German, Hungarian, French, and English, as well as numerous works by Russian writers, translated into German.

The castle park is located on the hill next to the building, its traces being visible to this day. The pond in the middle of this huge park decorated with many flowers and trees was once full of boats. The road from the garden led to the stairs in front of the portico. On the left, in front of the castle, there was a row of poplars and the whole garden was arranged in English style. The park was built by Bálintitt György, and only a few old trees remain, while the small lake has become a swamp.

The castle is currently privately owned and under renovation.

Bethlen Castle

Bahnea (Hu: Bonyha)

Located 40 km from Târgu Mureș.

Bethlen Castle in Bahnea was built in 1545 by Bethlen Farkas and was later transformed by Bethlen Elek senior and junior, between 1679 and 1719. On this occasion, they fortified the building with a stone wall, an octagonal bastion tower and a gate tower at the four corners. The exterior of the castle belongs to the romantic style, while the carpentry of the castle is reminiscent of the Neo-Renaissance and Romantic style. The building has 42 rooms, arranged on three levels - basement, ground floor and first floor.

During communism, the castle housed various public institutions, and after the change of regime in 1989, the condition of the castle deteriorated continuously. In 2008, the castle was returned to the heirs of the Bethlen family, who later donated it to the Reformed Church in Bahnea.

Renovation works are currently taking place here, with the aim of transforming the building into a multifunctional event center.





Barabássy Manor

Idrifaia (Hu: Héderfája)

The manor can be visited - YES

Located 28 km from Târgu Mureș and 20 km from Transylvania International Airport

The most prestigious inhabitant of the village of Idrifaia was, without a doubt, Barabássy Lénárd, vice-voivode of Transylvania and sub-prefect of the Szeklers. In 1508 he built his manor house in Idrifaia, which, according to some historians, was the first Renaissance building in Transylvania. In 1686 Barabássy's manor came into the possession of the Bethlen family of Ictar, who in 1745 renovated the baroque building, expanded it, then in 1803 modernized it, adding terracotta stoves and a carved fountain in the garden.

After 1990, the manor was on the verge of deterioration and total collapse. After a long period of litigation, the manor and the garden of about one hectare were returned to the descendants of the Barabássy family. The renovation of the manor began in 2008, and is almost complete.

Simén Manor

Călimănesti (Hu: Kelementelke)

Located 26 km from Târgu Mureş and 33 km from Sighișoara.

The manor of the Simén family was built on the place opposite the reformed church of the village. Built of brick and river stone, the manor was originally erected in a rectangular plan, and in the 20th century a porch and a covered terrace were added. Among the notable guests of the manor are Hungarian national poet Petőfi Sándor and Hungarian writer Jókai Mór.

The manor was built on a hill, overlooking the Târnava Mică river, and this location allowed the construction of vaulted cellars.

After nationalization, it served as a public building, and then it became the village's cultural home until 2006, when it was bought by the Petry family from Târgu Mures.

The current magnificent look is attributed to the Petry family, who, after a long period and a huge effort have redesigned the building, turning it into a winery and event centre, opening it at last in 2016.



The castle can be visited by prior appointment. Wine tastings or other events can also be arranged upon request.





Zichy Manor

Voivodeni (Hu: Vaidaszentivány)

Located 24 km from Târgu Mureș and 13 km from Reghin.

The history of the Voivodeni building complex, known as the Zichy Manor, is not entirely known. Judging by the architectural style, however, it seems that it was built in the 18th century or the beginning of the 19th century. The manor is a beautiful example of the Transylvanian Baroque from the end of the 18th century, which became the property of the Zichy family at the end of the 19th century. Its high roof, with triangular gables supported by eight Corinthian columns, offers an impressive image. The traditions of folk music and folk dance are preserved and cultivated faithfully in the village.

Currently, the manor offers space for various cultural events, but is not included in the tourist circuit.
